AUTUMN DOESN'T ALWAYS MEAN REST...



TOUR OF THE MONT BLANC-BREAKING THE ICE 2012 / 23 AUGUST - 6 SEPTEMBER

"Breaking the Ice" is based on a simple idea: out there in the mountains, solidarity and trust in each other are the conditions of survival. Getting a mixed group to face together the objective dangers and the aridity of the mountain environment should also allow for the emergence personal relations and challenging the negative representations of the Other.

This project is established in partnership with the Haifa University, whose responsibles are concerned by the lack of contacts between Jewish and Arab students.

Since 2010, groups of 8 to 12 young Jewish Israelis and Israeli Arabs, boys and girls, have been selected by the university, physically and psychologically trained, then sent to Switzerland accompanied by professionals of group dynamic. They spend two weeks in the Alps, an opportunity to walk together, face cold, rain and wind together, sleep

together and learning to stand each other (snorers know no nationalities...).

Once back at home, they commit to intercommunautary activities, including presenting their experience at the university, thus helping to spread the word about the program and recruit the participants of the following year.

"Breaking the Ice" is in its third year. Like last year, it involved a trekking in mid altitude mountain while camping in self-reliance. 2012 like 2011 has been plagued with a much mitigated weather, not to say terrible at times, the walks having had to happen under heavy rain shower, and even at times snow. The circuit took the group from la Fouly going through the Italian Val Ferret, walking up the Val Veny, cross the French border at the Col de la Seigne, to end the trek in Chamonix. It was thus a half tour of the Mont Blanc, guided again by Denis Ducroz and Jean Troillet. We'd like



to underline once more the very strong symbolic force for the participants to cross borders void of any check points, police and soldiers...

Upon their return to Israel, most of the participants have kept contact, taking part in debriefing meetings as planned; they have presented to various audiences their experience, have met again at various excursions they organise together in the desert. Some of these youth have shared with us how much their participation moved them, radically alternating their vision of the other side. A couple was formed, she an

Arab, he a Jew, who didn't know each other before. In the perspective of the Middle East conflict, these are drops in the Ocean one could be tempted to say. But the motto of Coexistences is that every action that leads to closing the gaps between the antagonistic parties is worth it, however modest it might be, if only for the personal benefits the participants derive, and also because no one can fathom the trickling effects such awareness could trigger.

JERUSALEM VISIT / 20 - 24 SEPTEMBER 2012

Further to the work the board dedicated to fundraising and the identified need to be more proactive in the development of new projects, Fiuna Seylan Ongen and Edgar Bloch visited Jerusalem to assess the impacts on the participants of the stays in Switzerland and evaluate the opportunity of collaboration with new groups of dialog and new institutions. ONO Academy, Zahava Neuberger from the JCJCR, TALI, SULHA, Mosaica, International YMCA Jerusalem, Neve Shalom and Search for Common Grounds were met.

In short, the trip to Switzerland is very beneficial for the dialog groups and has given them the impulse to continue the work back home. Coexistences is perceived as being a benevolent hosting institution and enjoys great respect for the quality of its volunteering hosting, and above all for its non intrusiveness into the dialog work being done by the groups.

A number of projects have emerged from this trip. At the Café Coexistences of December 3d, the various projects were detailed to assess the interest they raise and start setting up the various work groups.

The following 3 projects were chosen:

- Tali/JCJCR July 2013 A group of directors and their co-pilots of 8 schools who since 6 years work on their school pairing. You will remember that we had hosted some of their teachers in 2011.
 - The aim of the trip is to enable the directors, who are less involved in the day to day running of the program, yet are the true champions of these pairings, to allow them to get to know each other better, to work on the theme of dialog, and to meet people in charge of religious matter in Switzerland. The work group is formed and is lead by Daniela Hersch.

Sulha – May 2013 This organisation, born in 2008, organises large encounters aiming at reconciliation in big groups of 80-100 adults and of 40-60 young adults (16-21 yo), alternating dialog, meditation, music and walks in the desert. The SULHA project aims at hosting the 16 facilitators who since 2008 volunteer on their free time.

 Mont Blanc - Breaking the Ice - August-September 2013 Building in the long term the partnership with Haifa University and Beit Hagefen for students dialog, Francois Feihl and the work group will prepare this year's trip.

Ono Academy (the February 2010 group of religious leaders) wishes to continue its action, People's Peace Fund (Sulaiman Khatib who came in 2009 with the Wounded Xssing Borders group) has expressed his interest to work with us and we are continuing to explore with Mosaica (democratic development through the inter-religious dialog, minorities rights) the practical feasibility to host a mixed group of boys, orthodox Jews and East Jerusalem Palestinians.

As for the YMCA of Jerusalem, our historical partner, the priorities of his director Forsan Hussein have changed as he wishes to concentrate efforts on the development of educational programs locally. There are no immediate projects, but the doors are not closed.

Sylvie Berkowitsch resigned this summer from her position at the YMCA following the cancellation of the intercultural festival.
